## Pink buns day

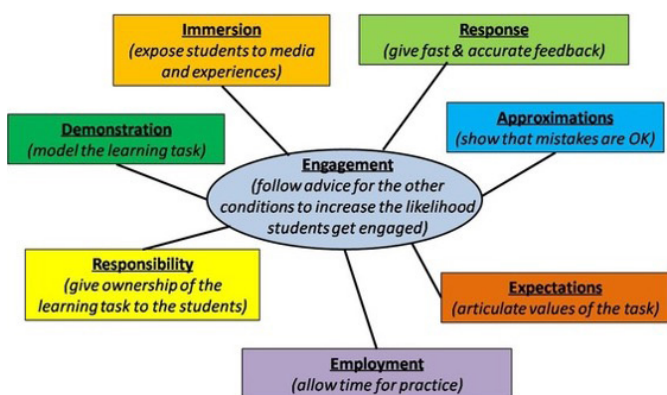

# Level Happenings

## Foundation

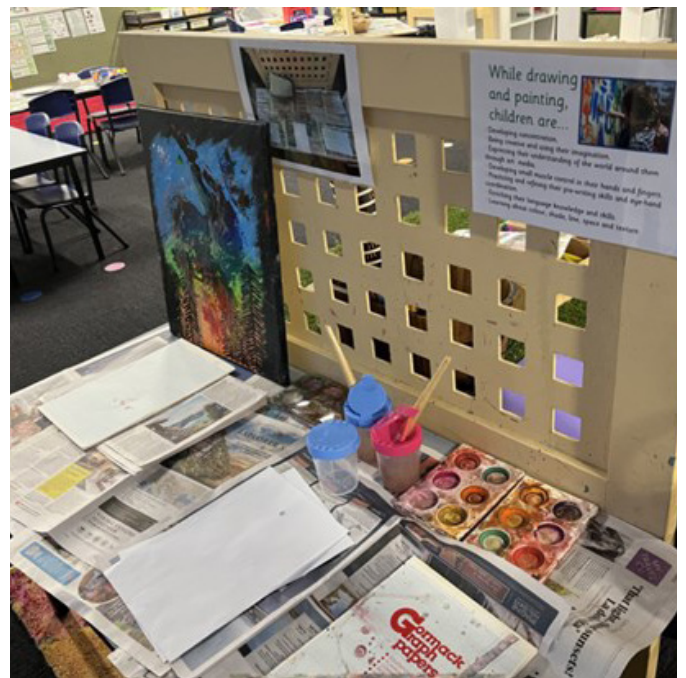
This week in Foundation, we've made a few changes to our room with new provocations for Investigations and the kids are loving these.

In Literacy we have been learning about the sounds and letters in the word zip, focusing on reading and writing our golden words and looking at sentence structure. We are trying to look out for sentences that have a CAPITAL letter at the start and finish with a full stop.

In Maths we have been playing a game called 'Double Dare' and it is helping us to learning addition skills. We have also been continuing to work on our counting patterns using a number line and place value.

On Friday last week we had our first incursion, and it was based on Chemical Science. In Science we are now looking at different materials used in a variety of objects. These materials are plastic, metal, wood and many others.

We are also in the process of assessing students and all the growth they have made so far.



## Levels 1 and 2

Week 6 in Level 1 / 2 started off with a BANG! On Tuesday, the Level 2s went to the Gould League for a science incursion, the Level 1s got to go on Friday.

During our visit to the Gould League we learnt about the 5 R's to reducing the rubbish we send to landfill: Reuse, Refuse, Rethink, Recycle and Reduce! We learnt so much about how to be more sustainable in our every day lives.

Did you know that single use, plastic forks and spoons are now banned in Victoria? You will see they have been replaced with bamboo, which breaks down much easier. When you're in the supermarket, try and opt for cardboard packaging rather than plastic!

We learned all about composting and how if we put our fruit and vegetable scraps in the compost bin we can reduce the amount of waste we create. Did you know that compost worms don't like citrus? Make sure you don't feed your compost bin any citrus fruits like limes, oranges and lemons. There are lots of other mini beasts that love your compost bins, which you might find inside yours. Did you know that slaters are apart of the crustacean family?

We have taken away many valuable learnings about how we can be more sustainable and we are excited to share our learnings with our families and friends.

**Date:** Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> June, 2023

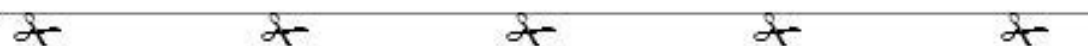
**Time:** 9:30am start – 2:15pm finish
