We chose this topic as everyone is asking for it and we hope that parents, as well as educators get a lot out of it.



This week in Foundation we have been busy.


We have been focusing on the sounds and letters in the word leg. 'L' as in leg, 'e' as in bed and 'g' as in gate.

We have been breaking words down to focus on the beginning and end sounds. We have also been using our learnt sounds and letters to explore and create new words.

In Maths, we have been continuing our focus on subitising. This is helping us to develop of number knowledge through fun and hands on activities. We are getting speedy with our counting.

We are also focusing on our number writing and it is coming along, we occasionally are reversing our numbers around but we are making this a focus for the rest of the term.

LOTE

Prep, Grade 1 and Grade 2 students were also invited to participate in performing at Monday's assembly. So they decorated some Chinese drum rattles and have been practising using them to make music along with the Lion Dance.





Level 1/2

This week in level 1 we have been learning all about chance and probability. We have been discussing the likelihood of something happening, will happen, might happen or will not happen.

Students have been given questions to discuss. For example: What is the likelihood of a pig running through the JLC?...It might happen but it is unlikely. What is the likelihood of a pig flying through the JLC...it will not happen, it is impossible. They have also been learning about things that have a 50/50 chance, like flipping a dice. That means each time you flip a coin there is a 50/50 chance it will be heads or tails, there is an even chance.

This week you might want to include this in your daily interactions. When heading home you might ask what is the likelihood of seeing a white car? What is the likelihood of seeing a pink car? What is the chance of us having takeaways this week? What is the chance it could rain this weekend?

The level 2's have been learning all about time, in particular half past and quarter past. Students are learning that if the big hand is on the 6 it means half past the hour and if it is on the 3 or 9 it is quarter past or quarter to. Time is a tricky concept to learn so rather than telling your child the time, work with them at home to be able to learn to tell the time for themselves.

Level 3/4

Level 3 and 4 students have had a busy 2 weeks with finishing NAPLAN, competing in the House Cross Country and finishing our ERPs! All students are looking forward to presenting their ERPs to our families on Wednesday the 5th of April at 3pm.

The Level 3 students showed great confidence and persistence during the NAPLAN period. All teachers are so proud of their effort and positivity.

Students are enjoying reading with each other and sharing their love of books.







Level 5/6

The highlight of week 9 was undoubtably the cross country. It was great to see all the students give their best and support not only their houses but also friends.

Homework has been handed out and is due back next Wednesday the 5th of April.

The Level 5's and 6's continues to focus on text structure, figurative language, and punctuation to enhance their writing. Our reading focus is centred around Authors, purpose, inferring and visualising the text. The Level 6's should have also finished Skellig by the end of the week.

Mathematically, our focus has changed to multiplicative thinking, subitising as well as finding ourselves delving into the world of division. A great way to help your child with this is to ensure they are practising their times tables; and test them when they are confident.
