

APPLE AND BLUEBERRY CRUMBLE

- 1 kg apples, peeled sliced and stewed
- 250g blueberries
- 1 packet white wings Buttercake Mix
- 100g butter, thinly sliced
 - 4 tablespoons brown sugar
 - 4 tablespoons coconut
 - 3 tablespoons flaked almonds
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
 - 1. Place apple and blueberries into a pie dish.
 - 2. Sprinkle evenly with dry buttercake mix.
 - 3. Thinly slice butter and place over the cake mix, covering it completely.
 - 4. Combine sugar, coconut, almonds and cinnamon together. Sprinkle over the butter.
 - 5. Cook in a microwave for 5 minutes on 650 watts
 - 6. Then 5 minutes on 650 watts/auto grill or until golden brown on top.
 - 7. Serve with cream or ice-cream.


