<b>First Aid.</b> Your voluntary contribution to First Aid, Health & Wellbeing, covers the purchase of first aid supplies, first aid kits required for school excursions and camps and first aid training for ALL staff. During recess and lunch our first aid area is manned by a fully trained first aider and open to all students.	\$100

<b>Building fund.</b> A tax-deductible contribution – vital for periodic enhancement and upgrade of our buildings, facilities and playground equipment which falls outside funding provided by the Department of Education & Training. #### **Financial Support for Families**

Sandringham East Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

#### • CSEF (Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund)

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions/incursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

#### State Schools' Relief

You will get help with school uniforms if your child is starting Foundation or year 7 <u>and</u> is eligible for CSEF (see above). State Schools' Relief will provide basic uniform items or a voucher if your student meets the criteria.

Help may also be available if you are facing: Health issues resulting in serious financial difficulty; house fires where school clothing is lost; natural disasters, or serious financial difficulty.

#### **FREE INSTRUCTION**

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

## PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



#### **Curriculum Contributions**

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

# Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

# Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



### FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.
